Q. My hair is 30 to 40 percent gray, and I've been dying it black. It now looks green. Is there anything I can do to correct this?

A. Most dark hair dyes have a green base that will show when you try to darken light gray hair. Using another dye or tint to

I suggest that any chemical service you might try should be done by a licensed professional.

Q. My sister is in her 70's and has started chemotherapy. She's never worn a wig before. What kind would you suggest? Human hair or synthetic?

A. Both styles can work out great. Synthetic girlfriends are usually less expensive, are offered in more colors, and have style memory. That means you can wear them for months, and they will keep their style. Most human hair wigs last longer but need more maintenance. Usually after wearing them, their curls will drop. They will need to be either wet set, flat ironed, or re-curved.

A. Yes Jheri curls or cold waves are making a comeback. The Chemicals are milder, so they don't need the extra juice that makes wet dripping hair. They can be worn virtu-

Actor Dulè Hill presented the prestigious Distinguished Artisan Award to legendary actress Allison Janney, known for her versatile and award-winning performances that she brings to life in collaboration with her make-up and hair teams across film, television and theater. Hill worked closely with Janney on "The West Wing." Janney has received a myriad of accolades, including an Academy Award, a BAFTA, a Golden Globe, and seven Primetime Emmy Awards, in addition to two Tony Award nominations.
