That is correct I want you to make up in vour mind come hell or high water that you will vote in every election that is held in the state of Michigan regardless of how long the voting

line is and regardless of the weather. Your vote is important, this is why you need to take some water with you and a small stool to sit on. Your vote will determine the property taxes we pay. the car insurance that we paid, the housing that is available for seniors, the schools our children attend. Your vote will determine the number of new job openings, the number of hospitals and hotels in our city. Your vote will determine the policies at our universities and the police force. Never assume that your vote does not count. Voting is the most essential activity that you will ever do in your life. People have died so you can vote. Elections come down to voter turnout so stand in line and make your vote count. And be sure to listen to our regular radio broadcast every Friday and Sunday on WHPR and television shows every Tuesday and Thursday. Remember you can register and vote at your clerk's office and you can apply for a mail-in ballot. I am going to play certain speeches regarding the need to vote. There will be speeches by Obama, Stacy Abrams, and others.

In the upcoming months, I am going to change our format significantly. During the months of September and October we will also be broadcasting throughout the week discussing the subject of voting. This year we will exhaust three subjects: breast cancer in black women, voting, and black men going to prison. Each of these subjects is essential for the black community. Our survival depends on the health of black women, our willingness to vote no matter what and the fortitude and determination of the black male. A better education tells a person reading is important, causing them to for the rest of their lives. Reading is a source of information that can help a person live a better life, understand their children and to retrain for a better job. The literacy rate in black communities is the lowest in the nation. The City of De troit where the literacy rate is one of the lowest in the United States, amounting to only 47.00% [1, 2], meaning that one out of every two adults or half of the population in Motor City is functionally illiterate.
